Meaning

- Determine participants' values and provide opportunities in which they can demonstrate them. Positive Emotions
 - Identify and provide activities, which promote participants' joy, happiness, contentment, satisfaction, optimism and hope.

Relationships

• Be intentional in fostering and maintaining participants' friendships.

Self-Acceptance

• Encourage personal reflection as a component of debriefing and evaluating experiences.
